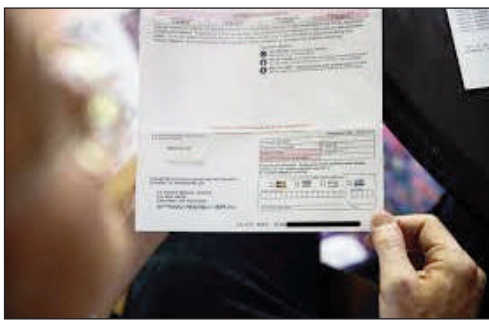

## NMMC sets up panel to check inflated bills by pvt hospitals

### Committee will submit report within 72 hrs after receiving complaints

The Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC) has set up a four-member Special Audit Committee to look into complaints of overcharging by private hospitals. The committee, consisting of additional commissioner, account officers and health officers will submit its report within 72 hours after receiving a complaint.

Despite the civic administration has issued instructions to private hospitals to adhere to tariffs decided by the state government, there have been complaints from citizens that private hospitals are overcharging for COVID and non-COVID treatments.

All the hospitals, nursing homes, maternity homes, dispensaries, and other medical support systems are registered under the Bombay Public Trust Act 1950 and their income is above Rs 5 lakh, 10 per cent of beds of the total beds have to

be reserved for common public.

However, the civic body received complaints from patients that private hospitals are overcharging for these beds. "The Special Audit Committee will conduct a comprehensive inquiry into the medical bills charged by the hospitals on the complaints received from the citizens as well as the treatment carried out under the Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Jan Arogya Yojana," said Sudhakar Sonawane, chief medical officer of

NMMC. He added that the committee will submit its report within 72 hours after receiving complaints. Sonawane is also a member of the committee which will be headed by additional municipal commissioner Sujata Dhole.

The Public Health Department of the Government of Maharashtra had already issued a circular on May 21, 2020, regarding the service-wise tariff to be charged for the treatment of non-COVID and COVID patients. In the circular, the municipal commissioner has been vested with the authority to strictly implement the guidelines for tariffs.

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## Thane Covid-19 tally rises to 42,420, death toll at 1,268

The number of COVID-19 cases in Maharashtra's Thane district has gone up to 42,420 after 1,878 more people tested positive for the disease, officials said on Monday.

Thane city accounts for over 25 per cent of the total cases in the district, as per an analysis of the data.

On Sunday, 1,878 people tested positive for coronavirus, taking the count of cases to 42,420, the district administration said in a medical bulletin.

Out of the fresh cases, Kalyan-Dombivli reported the maximum 482 cases, followed by Thane city-373, Mira Bhayandar-303, Ulhasnagar-251 and Navi Mumbai-

191. The remaining cases were reported from other civic limits in the district.

Besides, 47 patients succumbed to the disease in the district on Sunday, raising the toll to 1,268. Out of the 47 deaths, 16 were reported from Thane city, as per the medical bulletin.

So far, Thane city has reported 10,731 coronavirus cases, Kalyan-Dombivli-9,086, Navi Mumbai-7,793, Mira Bhayandar-4,314, Ulhasnagar-2,810, Bhiwandi-Nizampur-2,319, Ambernath-2,200, Badlapur-973, and Thane rural-2,194.

Thane city has till now also reported the maximum 402 deaths, followed by Navi Mumbai-244, Mira Bhayandar-162 and Kalyan Dom-

bivali-140. The remaining fatalities have been reported from other civic limits.

An analysis of the data showed the death rate in Thane was 2.99 per cent and the recovery rate was 50.19 per cent.

Besides, the neighbouring Palghar district reported total 7,274 cases and 144 deaths till Sunday, a report from the district administration said.

Senior BJP leader Devendra Fadnis, who visited some areas of Thane district on Sunday, told reporters that civic bodies in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region were not financially strong and had to depend on the state government and private hospitals for the treatment of COVID-19 patients.

## 55-yr-old corona patient hangs self

He was accompanied by BJP leaders including leader of opposition in the state legislative council-Pravin Darekar, MLA-Ravindra Chavhan, mayor-Jyotsna Hasnale, deputy mayor-Hasmukh Gehlot and standing committee chairman-Ashok Tiwari amongst others. The coronagraph of the twin-city has reached alarming levels. From 4,011 on Wednesday, the number of Covid-19 positive cases surged to 4,314 on Sunday, the highest increase of 303 cases registered by the civic body within a span of less than 24 hours.

## MBMC imposes hefty fines for spitting, not wearing masks

Wearing a mask, not to spit on roads and maintaining physical distance in public and at workplaces are some of the norms which need to be followed religiously in order to minimize and contain the spread of the deadly coronavirus. However, repeated appeals and warnings have failed to drill sense in the minds of some people, prompting the Mira Bhayandar Municipal Corporation (MBMC) chief Dr. Vijay Rathod to invoke the disaster management act and the stringent epidemic diseases act in addition to the relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code by chalking out stringent

punishments and hefty monetary fines on litter mongers and those found to be roaming in public places without wearing face masks. As per orders promulgated on Monday by the municipal commissioner, a person caught spitting in a public place for the first time will be fined Rs 1,000 and Rs 2,000 caught the next time. Similarly, anybody caught without a face mask in public will be slapped with a fine of Rs 500 for the first time and double the amount for the second time. Shopkeepers will also attract a fine of Rs 2,000 if they were found defying physical distancing norms for the first time and double the amount if caught for the second time.

## 9-day strict lockdown in Aurangabad from July 10

A lockdown with a slew of restrictions will be imposed in Aurangabad district of Maharashtra from July 10 to curb the rising cases of coronavirus, officials said on Monday.
